I recently finished my seminary training in Los Angeles, USA and moved here to Vancouver, where I started serving on July 1, 2019. During my ministry here, I have come to know this devoted couple, Brother Victor and Sister Annette Que, who not only love the Lord, but also care for God's people like me. My father is a busy Christian businessman, and my mother, having grown up in a rural province, follows traditional folk religion. Since childhood, I followed after my mother's religion, but not very zealously. My father was always diligently working, and rarely had time for church activities. However, every year at Christmas time, he would sing Christian hymns to us, his children. I believe that somehow, the Gospel seed may have been planted in my heart over many Christmases. Before I became a Christian, my desire in life was to serve in the government for my own advancement. That is one of the reasons why I came to America to study commerce. After graduating from college in Taiwan, where most of our faculty were also working in the government, I continued to enjoy life and leisure, running after my own dreams and goals just like the rest of my classmates.

Nonetheless, the idea of staying in America changed all my plans. I am now an American citizen, and never ended up working for the government. Instead, I have decided to use my remaining years to serve our Lord—this is made possible, all because of my one decision

to put my faith in the Lord. Proverbs 3: 6 says, "In all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." In February of 1990, while attending a home bible group, in the midst of singing hymns along with the others, my heart was struck by the fact that Jesus Christ, whom everyone was praising, is truly the One that I needed most! At that time I was single, and so far away from my home in Taiwan. I was a graduate student in Iowa, USA, and the burden of studies as well as the anxiety over my own future had suddenly thrown me into uncertainty about myself. Right then and there, I met the Lord! Through attending Sunday services at this church and recently taking the alpha course with pastor Iris Leung, I feel that I have been growing spiritually and I can see even more clear the difference God is making in my life from the inside. And I'm learning what it really means to be a Christian; it's the commitment required from my end to build and solidify a two-way relationship with the heavenly Father. Who Needs to Believe in Jesus Christ?



- 1. Nicodemus, a man of the Pharisees and a ruler of the Jews visited Jesus one night. Jesus told him that he must be born again to see the kingdom of God. He must be born of water and the Spirit to enter the kingdom of God. This means he needed to repent and accept Jesus as personal Savior to receive the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. (John 3:1-5)
- 2. An Ethiopian eunuch, who was a court official of Candace (queen of the Ethiopians) and was in charge of all her treasure was traveling along the road from Jerusalem to Gaza. He was a religious man who had come to Jerusalem on the feast of Pentecost to worship. He was on his way back and was on his chariot reading a passage of Scripture. Philip, as directed by the Spirit, went and joined him in the chariot to explain the Scripture to him. Philip shared with him the good news about Jesus Christ. The Ethiopian eunuch believed and was baptized. (Acts 8:26-39)

The Triumphant Cross of Christ

"...triumphing over them by the cross..." (Colossians 2:15).

The cross of Christ symbolizes His triumph and victory over His enemies. Through Christ's death on the cross, He has defeated humanity's seven main spiritual enemies: Satan, Sin, the World, the Old Man, the Flesh, the Law, and Death.

Satan. "The cross of Christ has disarmed Satan and his fallen angels' powers over God's children." (Col. 2:15). Although a defeated foe, Satan is still alive and well. He uses lies to deceive people into doing his will. If he could get you to believe his lies, he could then control your life.

The only way to combat Satan's lies is through God's truth. Jesus calls Himself the Truth (John 14:6). If we stay close to Christ, we will know the will of God that would reveal and disprove all of Satan's lies. Indeed, God's truth shall set us free (John 8:32) and empower us to live a victorious Christian life.

Sin. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23) The penalty for sinning is death. Someone has to die, either you or a heaven-sent substitute. Jesus was the sacrificial Lamb that God killed to take our place.

The Chinese word for righteousness consists of two characters. On top is sheep, and under it is I. The knife of God's punishment fell upon Jesus (the Lamb of God), and His blood cleanses us from all our sins.

Christ has taken your place. Death has occurred at Calvary. Once Christ has paid the penalty of sin, why still live under bondage? Claim your freedom by putting your faith and trust in Jesus. He is your Savior.

The World "...the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for our sins to rescue us from the present evil age" (Galatians 1:3-4)

The world can only offer the temporary pleasure of sin (Hebrews 11:25). But Jesus offers those who believe in Him a full, inexpressible, glorious, and great joy (1 Peter 1:18). He is the object of our real happiness and satisfaction.

He is the Security you seek in money.

He is the High you seek in alcohol.

He is the Ecstasy you seek in sex.

He is the Health you seek in doctors.

He is the Song you seek in music.

He is the Dance you seek in the clubs.

He is the Beauty you seek in travel.

He is the Wisdom you seek in books.

He is the peace you seek in worry.

It is Jesus whom you seek.

The Old Man "knowing this, that our old self (man) was crucified (by God) with Him (Christ)..." (Romans 6:6a) The old man refers to the old identity we have with Adam in our unregenerate state. It is who we are once in Adam. The death of Christ on the cross terminated our old identity as slaves of sin.

Christ's resurrection from the dead gave us a new divine life that is the life of Christ Himself. We have become new creatures in Christ who are holy, perfect, and set apart for God. Our new identity will change our confidence and behavior. Knowing who we are in Christ will remind us to act accordingly.

Recalling his boyhood as Prince of Wales, the uncrowned King Edward VIII said: "My father [King George V] was a strict disciplinarian. Sometimes when I had done something wrong, he would admonish me, saying, 'My dear boy, you must always remember who you are.""

It is my conviction that our heavenly Father says the same to us every day: "My dear child, you must always remember who you are."

The Flesh "Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires." (Galatians 5:24)

When God obliterated our old self with Christ on the cross, He gave us the power to overcome the sinful desires that remain in our brain and body. We learn to renew our minds and create new empowering beliefs, positive emotions, and godly habits.

As Bible teacher and pastor John MacArthur noted, "We have been removed from the unregenerate self's presence and control, so we should not follow the remaining memories of the old sinful ways as if we were still under its evil influence."

I was born and grew up in the Philippines. As a young boy, I had witnessed a procession of men who were carrying wooden crosses, whipping themselves. I also heard that some men were tied on the cross and even nailed to it. These religious people mistakenly believed that self-flagellation and self-inflicted torture could extinguish the flesh's evil proclivities.

Colossians 3:23 teaches that the harsh treatment of the body lacks any value in restraining sensual indulgence. Galatians 5:24 indicates that only those who genuinely belong to Christ have the power to say no to the body's evil cravings.

The Law "having canceled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us, He took it away, nailing it to the cross." (Colossians 2:14)

God's law is holy, righteous, and good (Romans 7:12). But Satan can distort the law's normal function and use it to provoke and increase sin (Romans 5:20). A legalistic mode of thinking gives the indwelling sin an advantage. Preaching more of the law is like adding more fuel to the fire.

Jesus died to save us from guilt and condemnation due to our failure to keep the law. People don't get liberated and transformed when we beat them with the law of Moses. They get liberated and changed when they encounter the grace and love of their Savior.

A Christian psychologist writes how he changed from being a slow reader to become a voracious reader. Whenever he read, his mother would be standing over his shoulder, instantly correcting him if he missed a word.

One day, he arrived home to the usual milk and cookies on the kitchen table. But this time, his mom seemed more at ease. She didn't say a word until he asked her for help. He felt relaxed and stopped worrying about the mistakes.

The counselor writes, "What worked was Mom giving me the grace to make mistakes, with no anxiety, no condemnation, or guilt - but lots of cookies and milk."

Death We do not shrink from death because of the blood of the Lamb shed on the cross (Revelation 12:11). The triumphant Cross of Christ takes the power of death from Satan's hands (Heb. 2:14).

When Jesus comes back, He "will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like His glorious body (Philippians 3:20-21). Inside your body is the blueprint for your resurrection body. With it, you'll be better able to enjoy an eternity of wonders God has prepared for you. Joni Erikson Tada says it well:

"Somewhere in my paralyzed body is the seed of what I shall become. The paralysis makes what I am to become all the grander when you contrast atrophied legs against splendorous resurrected legs. If there are mirrors in heaven (and why not?), the image I'll see will be unmistakably 'Joni,' although a much better, brighter Joni."

"May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ..." (Galatians 6:14a).
