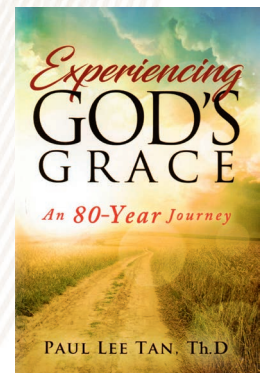
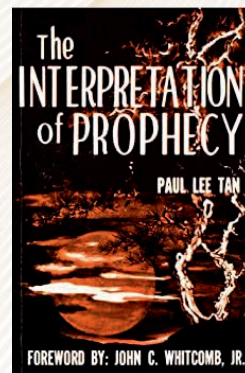
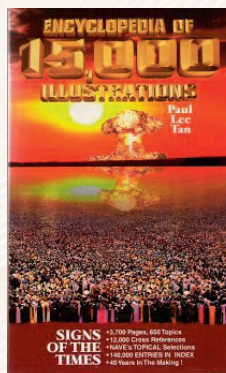
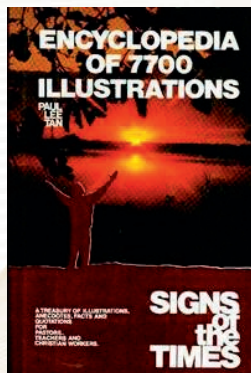
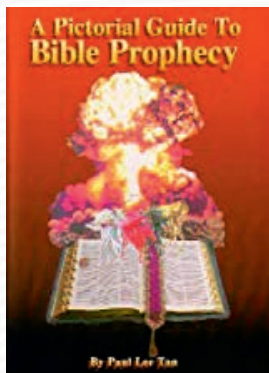
He has been a pastor for five decades, and preaches on prophecy for 50 years, in the United States & Canada, Asia, Europe, and Central & South America.




## Silent Worker of the Lord

**T**he Bible passage in Ecclesiastes 12:13 extols us: *"Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the duty of all mankind."* As Solomon explores various aspects of life, he concludes that only the fear of God can make a vain life meaningful, and obeying His commandments is the highest purpose of life. was posted as Philippine Consul General in Vancouver from 1999 to 2005. That was when I first met Victor, a member of the Philippine Trade Council known as PCTC.

In 2001, Victor made a courtesy call at the consulate seeking my advice as to the possibility of getting Usana into the Philippines market. Victor also brought me some Usana vitamins to try.

Usana Health Science, Inc had no interest in opening the Philippines because they did not see the market as profitable. I suggested to Vic to educate Usana that the Philippines' classification as a poor developing country does not define all Filipinos' purchasing power.

The Philippines, with a population of more than 90 million, had a wealthy population estimated at 10% or around 9 million, and add to that is the upper-middle class. That is a substantial moneyed market compared to Singapore, with a total population of more than just 3 million then.

The Philippines is the 3rd largest English-speaking country in the world. She has a young educated, and hardworking population searching for opportunities working overseas to earn U.S. dollars to support families. With a high literacy rate and being health-conscious, moneyed Filipinos can afford the USANA food supplement.

At that same time, as part of my function to promote Philippine business and investment, I organized a trade mission to Manila in cooperation with the PHILIPPINE-CANADA Trade Council. I invited business people and investors from British Columbia and Alberta and matched them with Filipino counterparts in Manila and Cebu.

Vic joined that very successful trade mission which resulted in some business agreements. We had an audience with then-President GLORIA MACAPAGAL ARROYO, who briefed the foreign participants on the profitability of investing or doing business in the Philippines. Vic was more determined and committed to open USANA in the Philippines, and he did not stop until USANA of Utah in the U.S.A approved USANA Philippines' opening. His patience, hard work, and passion for bringing the food supplement to the Philippines were highly rewarded. In 2009, USANA opened its head office in Makati. USANA became a successful and profitable business enterprise in the Philippines. In two years, USANA Philippines recorded as one of the highest global income profits. Vic and Annette brought opportunity and financial independence beyond their wildest dreams and expectations to many Filipino families with success.



But VIC remains humble and kind. He is generous and willingly shares his blessings with the less fortunate children and people in the Philippines. I believe this is his way of sharing his gifts with the community that supports and believes him.

### Ambassador Zenaida Tacorda-Rabago

**Ambassador Zenaida Tacorda-Rabago** is the first female Philippine Ambassador to Dhaka, Bangladesh. She served the Department of Foreign Affairs as the Finance and Coordinating Officer of the Office of ASEAN Affairs from 1967 to 1974 before taking and passing the Foreign Service Officers Exam in 1978. She represented the Philippines as the Third Secretary and Vice Consul of the Philippine Embassy in Paris; the Vice Consul, then Consul of the Philippine Consulate General in Seattle; Consul, then Acting Principal Officer of the Philippine Consulate General in Houston; Consul General in the Philippine Consulate General in Vancouver.

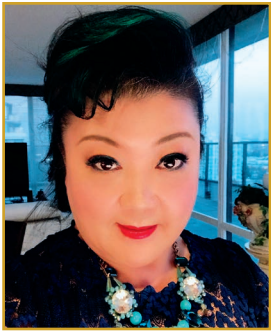

## 我的和藹業主郭先生 Victor - *Daisy Yeung*

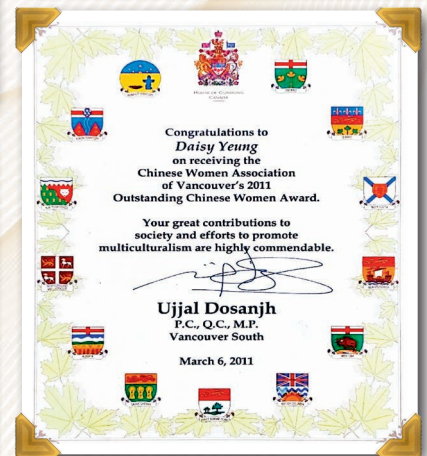
